



Educational Outreach



Workshops and Camps

As a core part of our mission, PCC designs highly customizable workshops which bring pop culture topics to educational spaces using top quality pedagogical practices for youth development and the years of art education expertise of our teaching instructors.

In 2023, we served more than 700 Denver-area kids and teens, offering unique in-person learning experiences in classrooms, libraries, and community centers in the Denver, Colorado, metro area.

Innovation Programs

Pop Culture Classroom continued to break ground in 2023, continuing to develop exciting new programs to engage kids and teens in active, transformational learning.

Literacy Education in Adolescent Detention (LEAD) Program

Pop Culture Classroom's teaching artists worked with students at the Gilliam Youth Services Center this fall on a graphic novel book study and comic-

creation course. Youth participants created concept art work that reflected their own backgrounds, stories, and journeys of personal transformation before collaborating with the professional artists on our teaching staff who finished the visual representations. The artwork will be released in spring of 2024.



Video Game Design

Director of Education Matt Slayter, our teaching artists, and Denver Public Schools teachers Olivia Conner and Kendall Graham, developed a special video game design program at the Denver Center of International Studies.

In the program, students in the STEAM Engineering elective work toward creating their own narrative-based video games with a pro-social message using Dreams — a game creation suite on PlayStation consoles. The program launched in early 2024 with high student interest and engagement.

The new student-created games will be showcased at a special exhibit in Denver in the spring. This program

was made possible with funding from the Redline Arts in Society Grant.

Educators' Day at FAN EXPO Denver

This year, Pop Culture Classroom welcomed 142 teachers, librarians, and other educators from Colorado and beyond to our annual special day of professional development at FAN EXPO DENVER.

Educators learned about using pop culture and creative self-expression to promote student engagement and success at sessions such as "D&D + TTRPGs for the Secondary Education English Classroom," "Discovering the Metallurgical Secrets of Beskar," and "Making Narrative-Adventure Games with Deck Nine."

Other Outreach to Colorado Educators

Pop Culture Classroom increased our efforts to connect with key educational stakeholders in 2023, appearing at The Rocky Mountain College of Art's Educators' Day in August and the Colorado Association for Gifted and Talented fall conference.

At each, we met passionate educators who wanted to deepen their use of pop culture in their classroom and were excited to learn about the free resources PCC has to offer. At PCC we believe no educator should have to pay for classroom curriculum!

Professionals Day at New York Comic Con

Pop Culture Classroom returned to New York Comic Con, participating in the LitX session "Titles You Should be Teaching and Reading" and offering our own well-received presentations on "Teaching Kids to Make (Good) Comics" and "Parenting and Teaching Tips from The Legend of Zelda: Tears of the Kingdom."






- **Educators and librarians** identify high-quality graphic literature to use in diverse educational settings.


Graphic Novel Teaching Guides



Community Events

Throughout 2023, Pop Culture Classroom created unique opportunities for educators, students, families, and fans to learn, create, and connect — reaching thousands at community events in Colorado and beyond.

FAN EXPO Denver

With three days of programming, FAN EXPO Denver is our biggest event of the year, and 2023 was no exception.

Kids' Lab + All Ages Stage

More than 3,700 kids, parents, and fans visited our Kids' Lab and All Ages Stage during FAN EXPO Denver 2023, which featured interactive learning experiences from Pop Culture Classroom and 15 community partners.

Our team helped attendees create hundreds of original keepsake fantasy maps, work to solve the puzzles in our Epic Portal Pursuit interactive adventure, learn to draw cartoon animals with our instructors, and much more.

Attendees learned writing insights from the Rocky Mountain Fiction Writers. The Colorado School of Mines shared fun facts from science fiction. Families explored local botany and climate with the Denver Botanic Gardens and



history with History Colorado. The Colorado Ballet held an Addams Family Dance party, and kids and teens explored their musical interest with the Boulder School of Rock.

And, since FAN EXPO Denver wouldn't be complete without some celebrity appearances,



Sarah Natochenny (the voice of Pokemon's Ash Ketchum) and Marty Grabstein (Courage the Cowardly Dog) shared stories from the All-Ages stage, and Christopher Lloyd (Back to the Future, Addams Family) joined Governor Jared Polis after the governor's remarks at Educators' Day.

Experience the Comics

More than 250 kids and teens participated in our Experience the Comics program at FAN EXPO Denver. The program provides special programming and FAN EXPO Denver access for students who may not otherwise be able to attend the event.

Working with Lafayette, Colorado Public Library and The Friends of the Lafayette Library Foundation, Pop Culture Classroom produced our first-ever Lafayette Mini Con. The event, attended by 676 kids and parents, featured attractions like:

In October, Pop Culture Classroom joined Aurora Public Library's annual mini-con event, where we worked with kids and teens to create their own fantasy maps and play through a Text-Based Pirate Adventure.



Celebrating Local Supporters

Geeks Who Drink's Quiz for a Cause hosted a special trivia fundraising event in support of our work in the lead-up to FAN EXPO Denver 2023. 
New York Comic Con
